Cultivar - 'Fancy Name' - 'Sango Kaku' Botanical Name includes all four parts Cultivar -maintained under the hand of man!






# Other Things to Consider When Selecting Woody Ornamentals



How about durable plants for dry areas that add color to the landscape?

























- Yaupon Holly (*Ilex vomitoria*)




Foundation Plants
1 to 5 feet tall




