Northeast Georgia Board of Realtors Invites Program to Train Over 100 Realtors

The Program was invited to the Northeast Georgia Board of Realtor's (Board) annual luncheon to speak to over 100 real estate agents on radon. The Board has agents in Gilmer, Fannin, Union, Towns, and Rabun Counties. These counties are among those at highest radon risk in Georgia according to historical testing data.

Realtors in attendance had the chance to share their experiences with radon. Several realtors expressed that their knowledge of radon helped them gain the trust of their clients. Others spoke about the challenges of getting mitigation companies to travel to more rural areas of Georgia. The Program looks forward to continuing its relationship with the Board and the communities it serves.
